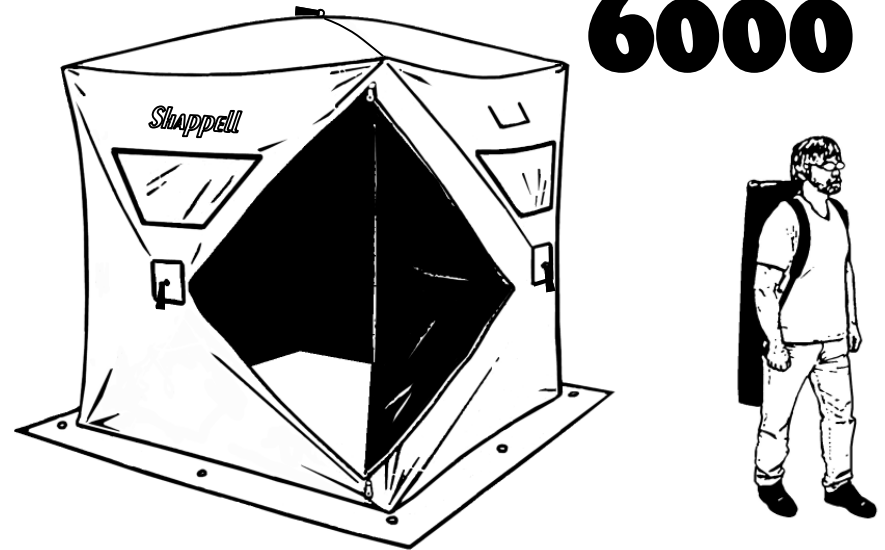

CARBON MONOXIDE POISONING HAZARD: This shelter must be ventilated if using an oxygen consuming heat source. **DO NOT PACK SNOW AROUND SHELTER** or in any way prevent fresh air from entering shelter. **Failure to Ventilate Shelter could create a Serious Health Hazard or Death.**

Window can not be made to withstand temperatures below -15° F. (see warranty)

MAINTENANCE: After each use, set up shelter until fabric is completely dry. **Never leave shelter folded closed with a wet cover.**

NOTICE: It is normal for fabric to have some pinholes. This does not affect water repellency.

READ SETUP & TAKEDOWN INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE USING SHELTER

Set Up

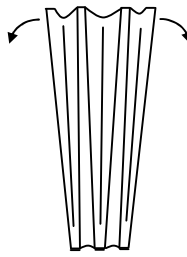

1) Remove Tent from Bag and set Hub End on Ice. (Fig. 1)

2) Unfold Tent and screw in Ice Anchor at one corner eyelet. (Fig. 2)

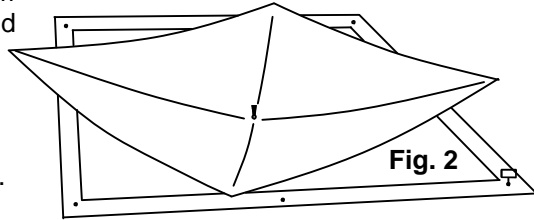

3) Jerk up hard on Top Hub so it pops up. (Fig. 3)

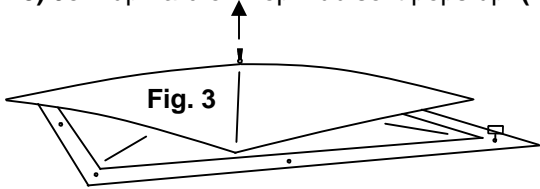

4) Pull out Side Hub while pushing against Top Center. (Fig. 4)

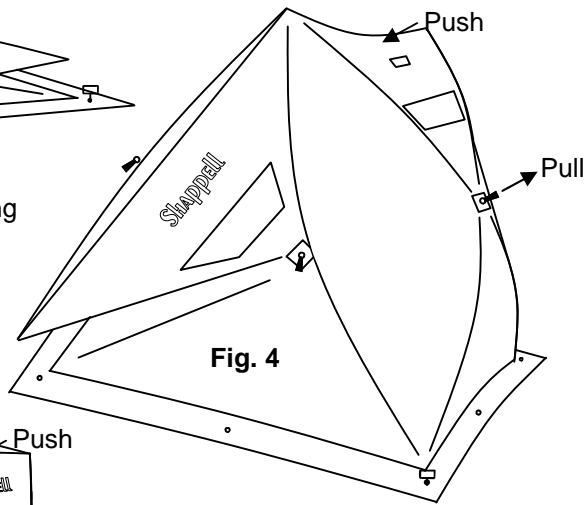

5) Pull out remaining Side Hubs. (Fig. 5)

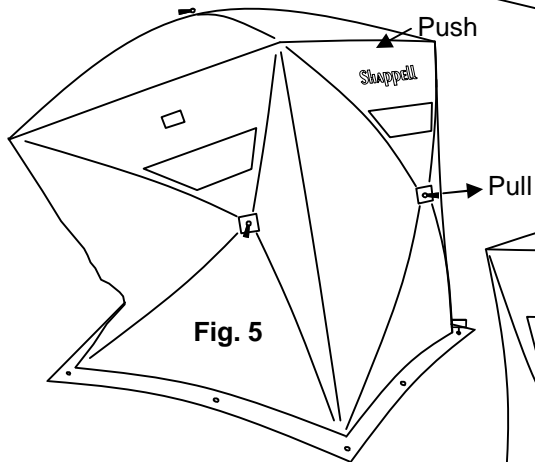

6) Install remaining Ice Anchors as needed. (Fig. 6)

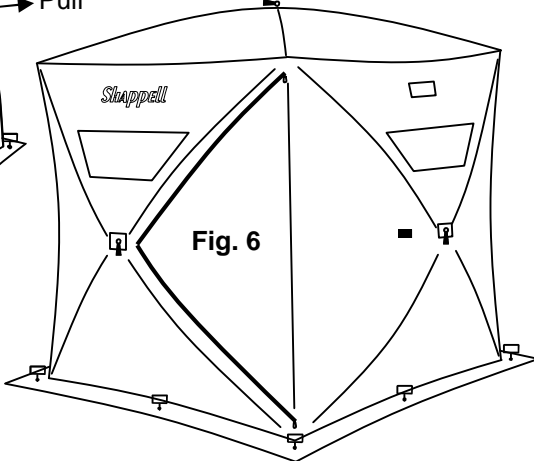

Take Down

1) Remove Ice Anchors, leaving one. Push in on Side Hub so it pops in. (Fig. 7)

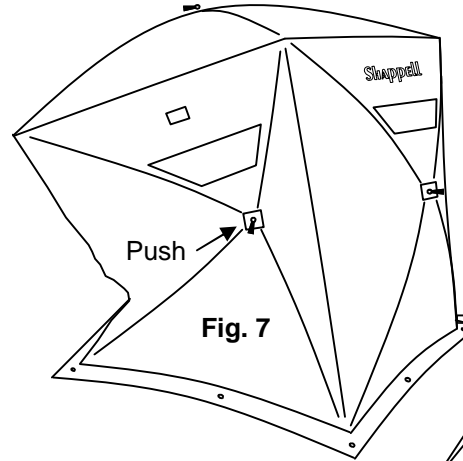

2) Push remaining Side Hubs in. (Fig. 8)

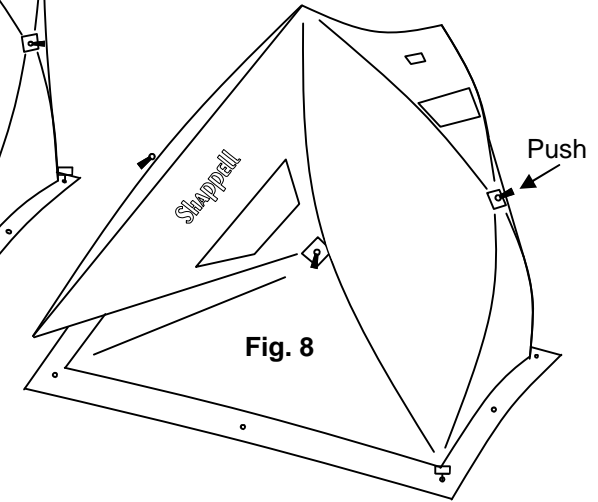

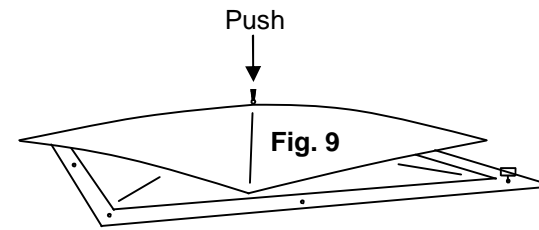

4) Remove last Ice Anchor and Fold all corners up. (Fig. 10) & (Fig. 11)

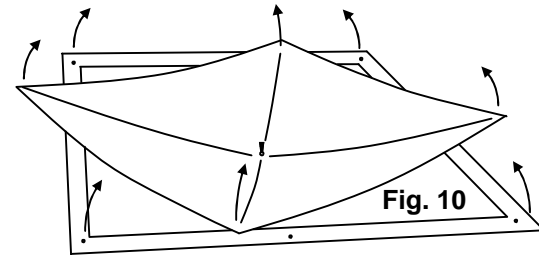

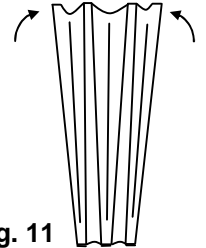
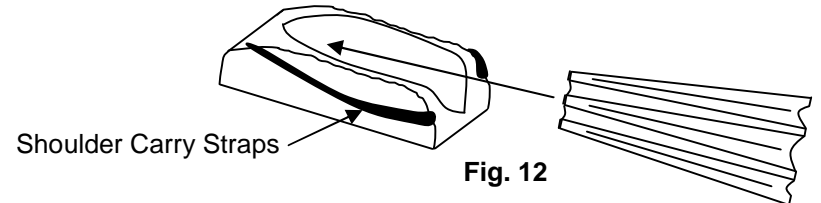
